 - c. Assess diversity in terms of climate (e.g., diversity initiatives) as well as performance in regards to diversity learning outcomes the latter is the purview of the ASLC (Added Item 9 to State of Assessment Report)
 - d. Involve student in the assessment of learning, program review, etc. each school should generate a list of student involvement in this regard (Added Item 10 to State of Assessment Report)

- 5. "Model" programs suggested for the EER "deep dive" include:
