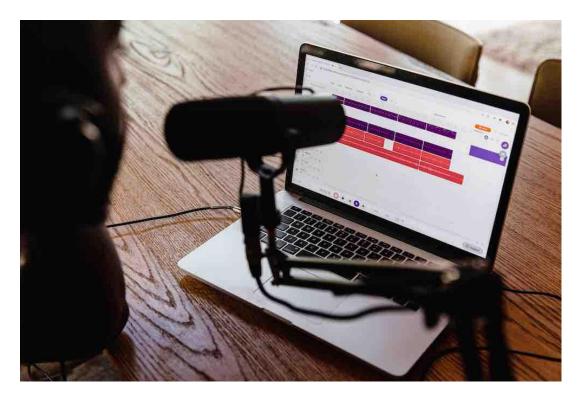

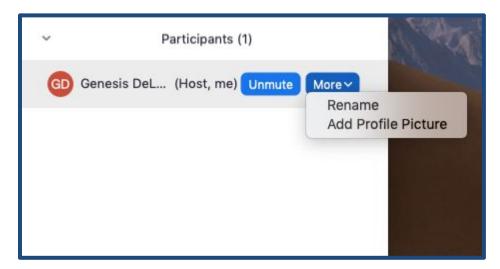

How Accurate are Surveys?

For eliciting truthful answers

- Internet surveys are better than phone surveys
- Phone surveys are which are better than in-person surveys
- People will admit more if they are alone than if others are in the room with them
- However, on sensitive topics, every survey method will elicit substantial misreporting. People have no incentive to tell surveys the truth.

COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement

COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement

To submit proof of COVID-19 vaccination, please follow the <u>instructions</u> for uploading the information to the <u>Student Health Center Portal</u>.

We understand that some may choose not to receive the vaccine due to medical reasons, or religious or philosophical beliefs. These individuals must claim an exemption by completing the <u>vaccination</u> <u>exemption form</u>.

- 1) <u>Upload Proof of Vaccination</u> OR
- 2) Submit Vaccination Exemption Form

Proof of vaccination or an exemption must be submitted by September 9, 2022.

University Immunization Requirement

General Immunization Requirement

To satisfy the University's immunization requirement, follow these steps prior to your arrival to Pepperdine:

- Complete the online Health History Form in the <u>Patient Portal</u>.
- 2. Enter the dates you received the <u>required immunizations</u> into the <u>Patient Portal</u>. These dates can be found on your official immunization records.
- 3. Upload your official immunization records **in English** into the <u>Patient Portal</u>.

Students can use their WaveNet User ID and password to gain access to their Patient Portal.

The deadline to complete the University's immunization requirement is Monday, August 15, 2022.



University Health Insurance Requirement

Student Demographic	Action Required
All PGBS students registered on the Malibu campus, both domestic and international, including those studying abroad.	Select one of two options on the AHP Insurance Dashboard by September 5: 1. Enroll in SHIP, or 2. Provide proof of an existing US-based health insurance plan by completing the waiver process Students who do not provide proof of US-based insurance and have an approved waiver notification prior to the September 5 deadline are automatically enrolled in SHIP are responsible for the charge on their student account.

To Do Before You Arrive on Campus

Negative COVID-19 Test Required Before Arrival

All students are required to take a rapid/antigen or PCR COVID-19 test within 72 hours before arriving on campus and log the result on the Entry Test Reporting Form.

- If you test positive, do not come to campus, isolate, and complete the <u>START Form</u>. If you test negative, you may proceed to campus.
- EXAMPLE: If you plan to arrive on campus for the first time on Monday, August 22, the COVID test should be
 administered between Friday, August 19 and Sunday, August 21 and the test result uploaded to the Entry Test
 Reporting Form by no later than Monday, August 22.
- The entry screening test is only needed the first time you access the campus.

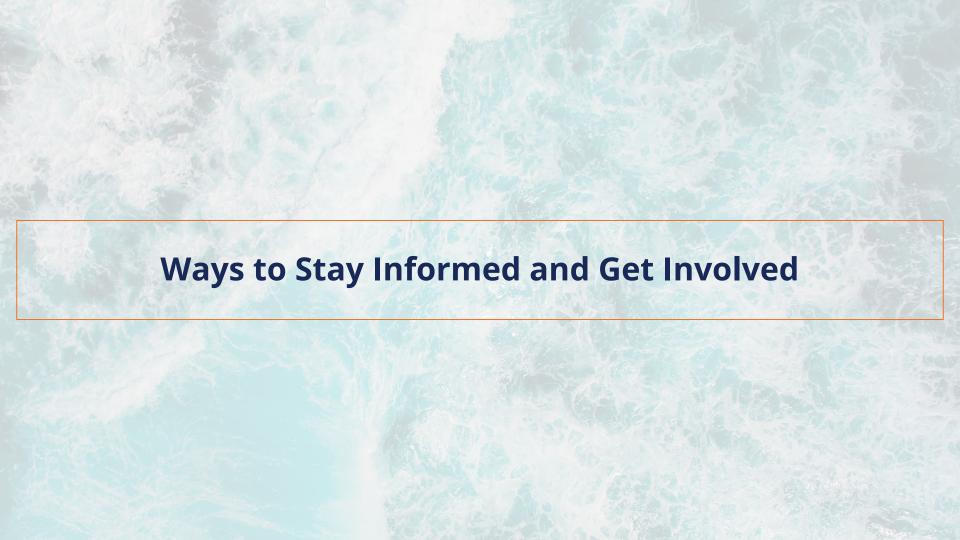

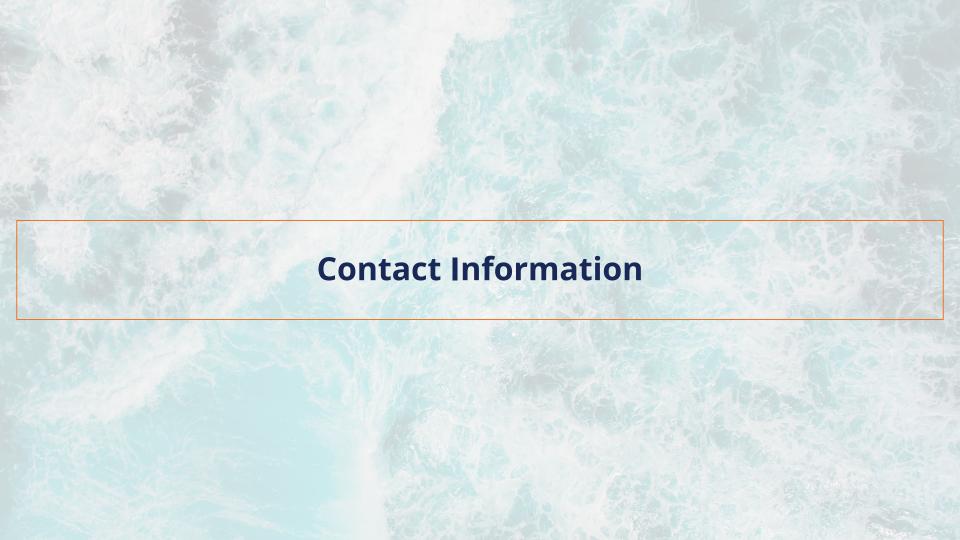

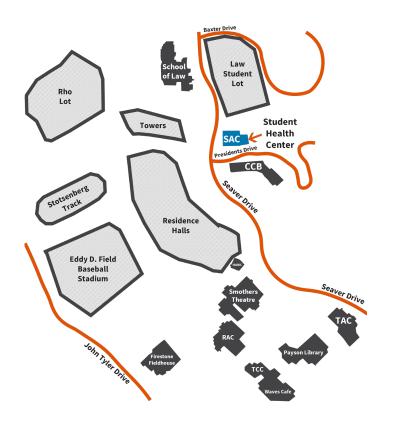
