Trimester Exchange


What is the Trimester Exchange program? An opportunity to study at one of our <u>elite</u> <u>partner universities</u> for a full term

Dates: April 23-29, 2023

Description: Creating Shared Value: Exploring Strategies to Generate Company Value and Societal Impact. This course will introduce you to the concept of Shared Value Creation. Developed by Michael Porter, Shared Value Creation is a strategic approach that seeks to unlock the power of business innovation to address societal needs while simultaneously creating competitive advantage. The Spanish Business Council for Sustainable Development has developed a roadmap for corporations to advance ESG performance and contribute to the global Sustainable Development Goals. We plan on visiting Spanish companies and organizations that are actively embedding environmental social and governance impact factors into their business models. These will include established multinationals and social enterprise start ups. We will also explore the ecosystem of social impact by meeting with NGOs and possibly government actors. This course will give students a hands-on experience in embedding values into business practices and strategies that can help solve some of the world's most pressing challenges.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I don't get into my first choice GBI program?

There are limited spots in each GBI, so you should register quickly for the best chance of getting a spot in your preferred course. You may ask to be put on the waitlist for your first choice, but please note that a change in registration is NOT guaranteed. When considering which program you prefer (Chicago or Madrid) prior to registration, you should think about the course description, travel dates, and potential visa requirements.

Am I required to stay at the same hotel the program provides?

Yes, all GBI participants are required to stay at the same hotel. If you request a shared room, you will be able to select your roommate. If you request a single room, you will be required to pay the supplement once the price and availability have been confirmed.

What expenses and arrangements am I responsible for?

You are responsible for paying for your **airfare**, **visa fees (if applicable)**, **and personal expenses (i.e. shopping and meals that are not included in the program)**. You are also responsible for completing all registration tasks as assigned, and obtaining your travel visa (if applicable).



Frequently Asked Questions

Should I book my flights once I am informed of my program placement?

No. You should not make any travel plans or any type of personal financial commitment until the Program Manager for your GBI notifies you to do so.

Can I bring a guest?

Guests are not allowed to participate in any portion of the program activities (including transportation).

When will we receive updated program details (i.e. vaccination requirements, syllabus, itinerary)?


Program health and safety requirements will be confirmed to the greatest extent possible before the registration date (January 9). However, some requirements and recommendations will remain fluid and are out of our control. Itinerary details will be shared at the program orientation in late February - early March. Program-specific requirements, draft itinerary, and academic information will be posted on the program **Via TRM** brochure as they become available. The professors will use **Sakai** for academic matters.






