- Semester Code/term (examples: Winter 2023, Spring 2023)


# Summer Course Creation Date is Right Around the Corner!

We hope that you are having a wonderful spring trimester!

Several weeks prior to the start of a new academic term, class sites are created in Courses (powered by Sakai), our learning management system. Summer trimester course shells will be available on or around March 15, 2023 in Courses. <u>Learn more</u>.

However, you don't need to wait until the course creation date to get started. You can start preparing your course(s) today by creating a Project Site! A Project Site, also referred to as a "Sandbox," allows you to build and customize your upcoming course(s) in the meantime. After March 15, 2023, you can then import all of the site's content to your new course shell. Learn more.

eLearning would also like to remind you that all of PGBS course sites have an Overview module that includes a template (view image below). The Overview module should be updated with *your* name, email, and phone number (if applicable) *prior* to publishing and making the site available to your students.

### **Faculty Highlight**



Reflections/Tips/Tricks or Best Practices in Teaching, Contributions to Communities, or Service Initiatives

As I reflect on my fifteen years of teaching and the honor of influencing thousands of students during that time, the following are three ideas that guide my everyday work as an educator. These "rules" are relevant for me when I mentor my students generally, but they apply even more so when I mentor the next generation of professionals who have a keen interest in a career in financial services.

**I teach my students to have courage**. I often reflect on the past and remember how awkward I was in certain situations, how ridiculous I must have sounded and looked when I did certain things, when I said certain things, or acted in a particular way, etc. These are the kinds of thoughts that occasionally wake me up at night. For instance, when I first reported to my regiment in Trento, Italy as a brand-new second lieutenant of the Italian Army, I will never forget how frightened, hesitant, and unauthoritative I was. — I was just the opposite of what I should have been!

But then I think back on the fact that, at least in those circumstances (i.e., a new business, job, relationship, etc.), I was present, I made an effort to engage in activities and initiatives, and I did say or do anything when appropriate. Then, I improved, learnt, and honed my talents by building on those acts, clear mistakes, and occasionally naiveté, one mistake at a time. Learning is therefore mostly a matter of experience, and as long as you have the confidence to act, everything will work out. I strive to instill in my students more courage.
