The Austria GBI, which was led by Kevin Groves, Darren Good, and Kristin Bailey, was an incredible week of exploring the Tyrol region, learning about the intersection of tourism and multi-generational family businesses, and enjoying meaningful exchanges with a group of diverse students across many PGBS programs. Our outstanding host, Management Center innsbruck (MCI), arranged three engaging expert speakers on Family Business and Tourism in Tirol (Professor Anita Zehrer), Sustainability of Tourism (Professor Birgit Bosio), and Responsible Leadership at SOS Children's Villages. Our MCI hosts went to great lengths to ensure that our faculty team was very well-supported throughout the week-long intensive. In many ways, MCI ensured that every aspect of our visit, including meals with MCI leaders, responsiveness to student needs, and accommodation of our requests, was meaningful and high-impact for our students. Throughout the week, we visited five multi-generational family businesses and learned about a specific challenge facing each business: Grassmary Bell Foundry (longevity), Swarovski International (governance and succession), Med-El (innovation and product development), Alpen Resort Schwarz (Sustainability), and Huter & Sohne (entrepreneurship). For many in our group, the highlights of the trip include a short hike to an alm for a private dinner on the beautiful Resort Schwarz property and the vernacular ride to the top of the northern mountain peak for a birds-eye view of the city and the Alps (photo above). It is our sincere hope that PGBS can continue cultivating a strong partnership with MCI that will produce many more opportunities for our students, faculty, and staff.
