As the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, I am pleased to share with you our four key priorities for the 2024-25 academic year:

- Successful AACSB Review: We will focus on ensuring a successful AACSB review, which is critical for maintaining our accreditation and reputation as a top business school.
- 2. Building Community and Strengthening Morale: We are committed to fostering a sense of community and strengthening the morale of PGBS faculty and staff. This includes creating more opportunities for collaboration, professional development, and social events.
- 3. Expanding Opportunities for Faculty Flexibility: We aim to expand opportunities for faculty to fulfill their contract by teaching two trimesters a year, allowing for more flexibility and work-life balance.
- 4. Laying a Foundation for 12-Weeks of Direct Instruction: We will begin laying the groundwork for the implementation of 12-weeks of instruction each trimester. This will provide more time for faculty to conduct research, and allow more transition time between each term.

Here is a concise summary of our findings:

Overall eLearning Course Index Score: 3.69 out of 5

Online Programs: 3.9Hybrid Programs: 3.18

Strengths

- Consistent structure and navigation across courses
- · Operable course content
- 50% of courses scored 3+ on all eLearning standards
- 60% of courses have an eLearning index score of 4+

Areas for Improvement

- · Sharing course and weekly learning objectives within the course
- Some courses need improvement in structure/navigation, content operability, and accessibility
