


A Special Easter Message from Dyron Daughrity

"He Must Increase, I Must Decrease"

One of the great New Testament figures is John the Baptist. He became a famous preacher. Crowds flocked to him. He baptized many people and acquired a huge following. Many Jews claimed him as their rabbi.

However, around that time, Jesus Christ came onto the scene. Immediately, John the Baptist humbled himself, and declared: "He must increase; I must decrease" (John 3:30). John claimed he was not even worthy to untie Jesus's sandals.

John acknowledged the supremacy of Jesus in all things, saying, "The Father loves the Son and has placed everything in His hands. Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life" (John 3:35-36).
