## **Announcements**

- Dana Dudley reminded cabinet members about the upcoming Dean's Lecture "An Evening with Rachel Denhollander" on November 13 at 5pm in Elkins Auditorium
- Michael Feltner shared announcements regarding the following:
  - David Holmes Reception will be December 6 at 2pm in the TAC 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor Lobby to honor his 26 years of service.
  - Paul Begin will be the Interim Associate Dean for Curriculum and General Education and Mike Sugimoto will become the new Interim Divisional Dean for the International Studies and Languages Division effective January 1, 2020.
  - We will have a Cabinet New Year Celebration on Monday, January 6, 2020. A "save the date" announcement with the time and location will be forthcoming.

## **Business of the College**

- Assessment and Program Review Lisa Bortman discussed the timing and procedure for our
  upcoming assessment and program reviews. The WSCUC report is to be submitted a year from
  now. Earlier this year OIE requested updated assessment plans from each area and she will
  conduct workshops/lunch per division as appropriate.
- Strategic Plan Update Michael Feltner discussed the general plan and timeline for the
  development of a new Seaver College Strategic Plan concurrently with the new University
  Strategic Plan. The Seaver College Strategic Plan Steering Committee will meet in early January.
  There will be an opportunity for Seaver College Faculty and Staff to attend a forum on the
  morning of January 29, 2020.
- Hiring Michael Feltner discussed ways the University is working to have our faculty composition more closely reflecting our student composition. Seaver College has been going in the right direction we will continue to implement things we can do to be more successful.

Kristy Collins presented an update regarding Seaver College admissions. She indicated that
approximately 90-100 students are anticipated to enter in January class for the spring 2020 term
and that, despite an ever-changing college admissions environment, Seaver College is well
positioned to meet our goals since approximately 5,000 early applications were received by the
November 2019 deadline.
