

## Heidelberg Summer 2017 Textbooks

Students in the Heidelberg program must purchase their books before the program and either a) bring their books with them to the program, or b) have their books shipped to Moore Haus. Students should purchase all the books listed for a course. **All students must have their textbooks on the first day of class!**

**You can purchase your textbooks at the Pepperdine bookstore or buy them online and have them shipped directly to Moore Haus.** The following websites can ship books to Heidelberg:

- [www.amazon.com](http://www.amazon.com) and [www.barnesnoble.com](http://www.barnesnoble.com) both ship abroad, but the shipping charges are very expensive. The information can be found on the websites.
- Because shipping from the States is so expensive, we recommend the students use [www.amazon.uk.co](http://www.amazon.uk.co) (which is Great Britain) or [www.amazon.de](http://www.amazon.de) (which is the German site). Ordering from the German site eliminates customs charges and reduces shipping fees.

Most textbooks needed in Heidelberg are available on [www.amazon.de](http://www.amazon.de) under the category "Englische Bücher" (English books)

To order from [www.amazon.de](http://www.amazon.de):

- a) Click on "Hilfe" (which means help) in upper right hand corner
- b) On the next screen, scroll down until you find on the left side "Information for English speaking customers"
- c) Click on this and you will find all ordering instructions in English.
