01 Courses Offered Abroad

Before you accept your application, it is crucial that you have an academic plan- after all, it is school! If you are not sure of the classes being offered at your respective program, make sure you visit our **Community Page** to see the courses offered in your program.

- Are there specific classes I need to take before I go abroad?
- What about the language requirements?

 - Are there academic requirements I must fulfill to be eligible to abroad?



PREREQUISITES

Planning to study abroad starts right here in Malibu. In order to capitalize on the classes offered in your program, it is important that you fulfill any necessary prerequisites. These requirements are listed on your program's web page or in the academic catalogue. Be sure to take a look and keep prereqs in mind when you register for your Spring 2019 classes!

As a general guide, these are the classes you should take before you go abroad (academic year, fall and spring students only):

Buenos Aires: ENG 101, HUM 111, REL 101, SPAN 151 Florence: ENG 101, HUM 111, REL 101, ITAL 151 Heidelberg: ENG 101, HUM 111, REL 101, GER 151 Lausanne: ENG 101, HUM 111, REL 101, FRE 151

London: ENG 101, HUM 111, REL 101 Shanghai: ENG 101, CHIN 151 DC: REL 101, ENG 101, COM 180





LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Learning a language is a journey that will give you a lifelong skill. One of the benefits of studying abroad is the chance to practice foreign language skills in the real world. Most importantly, you can connect with locals and engage with the culture in a personal way! To help students deepen their study abroad experience, we require students studying abroad for the academic year or a single semester to be enrolled in a language course while they are abroad. Students going abroad during the academic year are also required to take the first level of the corresponding language prior to going abroad (DC and London are exempt from these requirements).

During the summer, students studying in Florence, Lausanne, Shanghai, Heidelberg or Buenos Aires are required to take a 1-unit language survival course while studying abroad if they have never taken the language of their program before. Students don't need to take a language course prior to studying abroad in the summer, unless it is a prerequisite for a class they plan to take while abroad.

Students are sometimes permitted to test out of language courses. Contact the International Studies and Languages Division (link to their website) for more details.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

You must fulfill these requirements to be eligible to go abroad. See your IP contract or the IP Student Handbook for more details.

TO APPLY FOR ANY IP PROGRAM, YOU MUST:

- Have completed 30 college units or two semesters by the program start date
- Have a 2.5 cumulative Pepperdine GPA
- Not be on academic probation
- 151-level language course requirement*

TO MAINTAIN YOUR ELIGIBILITY TO GO AND REMAIN ABROAD, YOU MUST:

- Fulfill any necessary prerequisites (including Language 151*)
- Be enrolled in the minimum number of required units, and enroll in any required courses while abroad
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA in every term prior to going abroad
- * Not necessary for Summer students
